In addition to a brief refresher on the impact a criminal record has on a person's ability to obtain gainful employment, we will explore the inter-relationship between criminal records mitigation and other aspects of Legal Services work, such as unemployment, housing, consumer, family and public benefits matters with an emphasis on new work search requirements.
