

Legal Aid Attorney Guide to Collecting Attorney Fees in Consumer (and Other) Cases

This program is intended to provide instruction on where attorney fees might be available and how to recover those fees. This is especially relevant since LSC-funded programs are again permitted to recover such fees.

The chief presenter for the program will be Cary Flitter, an attorney in private practice who specializes in representing consumers in consumer law issues in both individual and class actions.

Mr. Flitter is on the adjunct faculty at Widener University School of Law and Temple University Beasley School of Law. He is one of the principal authors of *Pennsylvania Consumer Law* (Carolyn Carter, editor) and is a contributor to NCLC's *Consumer Class Actions* (5th ed.). He has also served on the board of the National Association of Consumer Advocates (NACA).

Eileen Yacknin of NLSA will also review other cases in which legal aid attorneys can seek fees.
